GRAND NATIONAL SHOW COVID-19 ACTION PLAN AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE

All Staff, Licensed Officials, Volunteers, Exhibitors, and Participants are required to:

- Undergo a COVID-19 Screening upon entry to the arena each day (temperature check + symptom questionnaire).
- Wear a cloth face covering at all times when not mounted on a horse.
- Maintain social distancing (6 ft) between themselves and any individual that is not a member of their household.
- Practice good hand hygiene (frequent washing of hands, use of hand sanitizer, not touching face, etc).

All Staff, Licensed Officials, and Volunteers:

- Will be given a personal sanitization kit that includes extra face coverings, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, and gloves.
- Will be divided into 'cells' to minimize cross-interaction.
- Will communicate via dedicated messaging channels, walkie talkie, or phone call **whenever** possible to minimize contact.

Exposure Protocol:

- In the event an individual is exposed to another individual with a confirmed COVID-19 positive case, that individual will be required to leave the Show Grounds and will not be able to return during competition.
- In the event an individual exhibits symptoms of COVID-19 **and** a fever during the competition that individual will be required to leave the Show Grounds and self-quarantine. That individual will only be allowed back on the Show Grounds with a confirmed Negative COVID-19 test result **and** medical clearance from a physician.
- In the event an individual exhibits a fever but **no** symptoms, that individual will be required to leave the Show Grounds and will be allowed back on the grounds only when their temperature returns to normal **and** they have received medical clearance from a physician.

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If any of the above scenarios take place, Show Management will consult CDC recommendations to determine what other individuals will need to quarantine (leave the grounds) or seek medical opinion as a result of any contact or possible contact with the individual. Show management will contact affected individuals via phone in this event.

In addition to the temperature checks on-site, participants are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds.

Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher may not enter the facility.

ANYONE WHO: - exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, - has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or - *has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks **CANNOT ENTER THE COMPETITION GROUNDS**

Any individual who exhibits symptoms or a temperature over 99.5 or comes into close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the two weeks preceding the Show or while at the Show, is required to send an email informing Show Management to safety@pfhagns.com.

**Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.*

Please note that all participants are be required to inform Show Management and USEF by emailing safety@pfhagns.com and ksacco@usef.org if they are exposed or test positive in the 14 days **following** the show as well. At which time Show Management will notify all participants of the possible exposure (while maintaining the individual's anonymity).

Your cooperation with these regulations is vital to ensuring the safety of your fellow GNS participants. Should you need to report for any of the above reasons, your privacy will be maintained by Show Management.

The COVID-19 Compliance Officer will document any and all situations concerning any potential individual who is unable to comply with any of the requirements. The Compliance Officer will inform the Chief USEF Steward who will also make documentation.

TRAINING

All Show Personnel, Staff, Licensed Officials, and Volunteers will be trained in the COVID-19 Action Plan + Emergency Response Protocol via Virtual Meeting in advance of the Show.

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COMMUNICATION

All Show Personnel, Staff, Licensed Officials, and Volunteers will be divided into cells to minimize cross-interaction. Communication between personnel will be via dedicated messaging channels to maintain a fluid chain of communication.

ISOLATION

If an individual on the grounds is displaying symptoms or has a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher according to the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan and is unable to travel independently and immediately away from the competition grounds, the individual will be asked to remain in an isolation area away from others until private transportation can be organized.

An Isolation Room will be located on level 2 of the Practice Arena Announcer Building and will be stocked and prepared by the COVID-19 Compliance Officer prior to Exhibitor arrival.

Any use of the room will be properly documented by the COVID-19 Compliance Officer. The Isolation Room will be cleaned and disinfected in accordance with CDC Guidelines by GNFA staff following any use.

All Requirements in the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan will be enforced. Any individual found to be in non-compliance will receive one Warning which will be documented by the COVID-19 Compliance Officer and a USEF Steward. The second violation will result in removal from the Show Grounds and disqualification of all entries **without** refund.
